Project Overview

Reconstruct roadway from 300 South to 800 North, including:

- Reconstruct with concrete pavement
- Adding buffered bicycle lanes
- Replacing utilities
- Installing storm drain system and curb/gutter
- Installing multi-use path (east side) and wider sidewalk (west side)
- Adding signalized bicycle crossing at 300 North
- Installing raised, planted medians
- Improving crosswalks

Extend new storm drain system to 500 South

Add buffered bicycle lanes from 800 North to Bulldog Boulevard






Purpose & Need

Purpose: This project will replace failing asphalt with new concrete pavement, improve operational safety, provide active transportation facilities, and replace the drainage system.


Need: The asphalt pavement between 300 South and 800 North has reached the end of its operational life expectancy and is beginning to fail. Also, the existing drainage system between 800 North and 500 South is insufficient.

Recreation Resources



Publicly-owned parks are protected under Section 4(f), Department of Transportation Act of 1966

- The proposed project includes a 10-foot wide multi-use path that would use a portion of the park property to avoid removing trees.
- The impacts to the park would not adversely affect the activities, features, or attributes that make the park eligible for Section 4(f) protection. Therefore, UDOT recommends that a *de minimis* impact determination is appropriate.






Active Transportation

The project aims to improve the roadway for all kinds of road users, including bicyclists and pedestrians:

- On-street, buffered bicycle lanes from 300
 South to Bulldog Boulevard
- Bicycle crossing at 300 North intersection
- 10' multi-use path (east side) and 6' sidewalk (west side) from 300 South to 800 North
- Improvements at 500 North intersection
- Pedestrian-controlled overhead flashing lights at 100 South
- Improved school crossing at 200 South, with overhead flashing lights
- Bulb-outs installed on local Provo side streets








500 South to Bulldog Boulevard


500 North Intersection

Construction Impacts

Similar to UDOT's recent 300 South Project, rebuilding 500 West in concrete will require closures to driveways and side streets for periods of 14-30 days while crews place base materials, concrete, and allow it to cure.

Also, to complete this project in one construction season, we anticipate **some** activities will need to occur at night when traffic volumes are lower.

You can expect 500 West to be reduced to one lane in each direction during construction.
